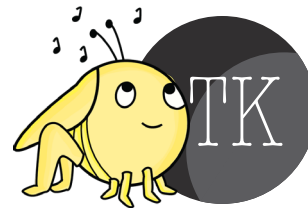
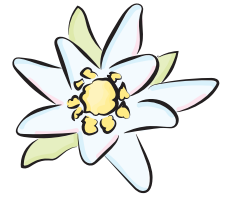

They can give birth to live babies, hatch eggs inside of their bellies, or lay eggs on seaweed. How cool!

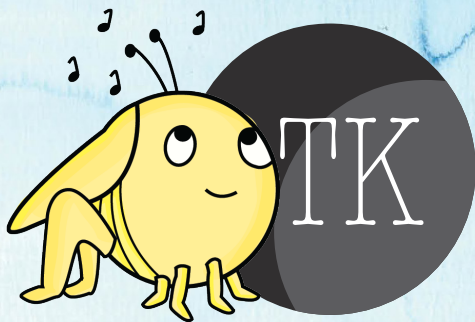
